He was also a God fearing man, a motivator and a unifier, which was evident with his songs: such as *Vun'we; Ntwanano; Xikhongelo xa Hosi; If you work hard; Matimba ya vuyimbeleri* and may other great pieces he composed.

It is therefore, very important for us as government and as a community – to honour him, because of his vast contribution to the choral music community and to the art of music as well as the society's moral regeneration agenda. His ability to arrange pieces that healed souls has not gone unnoticed.

It is a general knowledge that choral music expresses the deepest parts of our humanity. It relaxes our minds, and it's a kind of an emblem for what we need in this world when so much of the world is at odds with itself.
